

COURSE TRANSITION AND TEACH OUT POLICY

PURPOSE

This policy set out the principles by which CG Spectrum Institute (CGSI) manages its accredited higher education courses in 'teach out' mode to ensure students are not disadvantaged and the quality of courses is maintained, and course transition.

SCOPE

This policy applies to CGSI's accredited higher education courses in circumstances where:

- the Academic Board determines, as a result of the course evaluation and review process, that CGSI will not apply for re-accreditation of an existing course, and there will be no students enrolled at the due date for renewal of course accreditation renewal, as they will have completed or transitioned out of the course;
- the Academic Board determines that CGSI will not apply for re-accreditation of an existing course, however there will be students enrolled past the current course accreditation renewal date; or
- A course enters teach out mode as a result of a decision by TEQSA or by CGSI (on consideration and approval of the Board of Directors and the Academic Board), and there are students still enrolled in that course.

DEFINITIONS

Teach out mode means that no new students can be admitted into a course, and arrangements are in place to ensure current students can either complete the course of study or transition into an alternative course without disadvantage.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Academic Board is responsible for determining:

- whether CGSI will apply for re-accreditation of its accredited higher education courses; or
- whether CGSI will enter teach out mode when there are still students enrolled in that course, on its own initiative

The CEO is responsible for:

- the implementation, and compliance monitoring, of this policy;
- determining whether CGSI will apply to TEQSA for renewal of the accreditation for a course in teach out mode so as to enable students to complete the course in which they originally enrolled;
- providing a business case to the Board of Directors and Academic Board where CGSI proposes to enter teach out mode on its own initiative;
- developing an appropriate budget for transition and teach out arrangements when required; and
- any material change notification to TEQSA

The Executive Dean is responsible for:

- ensuring new students are not enrolled into a course once it enters teach out mode;
- developing the teach out plan for each student enrolled in a course in teach out mode;
- developing course transition plans for each student enrolled in a course where



Academic Board has determined that course accreditation will not be renewed or where CGSI has elected to teach out on its own initiative;

- closely monitoring each student's academic progression against the teach out or course transition plan; and
- developing and implementing agreements with other higher education providers to enable students to complete their course by transitioning into an equivalent course with another higher education provider in the same Field of Education (when CGSI does not have an alternate course for students to transition into).

POLICY

- 1. The Academic Board will approve the teach out or course transition plan before a course is moved into teach out mode (unless the teach out mode is as a result of a TEQSA decision).
- 2. A course can only be in teach out mode while it is still accredited.
- 3. The teach out or course transition plan must demonstrate how students enrolled in the course will be able to complete the course they originally enrolled into, or transition into a mutually agreed alternative course, either with CGSI or another higher education provider. The plan must also demonstrate how the quality of course delivery will be maintained during teach out.
- 4. CGSI's teach out or course transition plans will not disadvantage students in terms of:
 - course progression and completion, or
 - financial cost.
- 5. Wherever possible, students who have not completed the course within the period of the teach out plan will be assisted to transition into an alternative course.

6. Tuition Assurance Scheme

CGSI ensures that it has in place tuition assurance for current students. This arrangement protects student fees paid in advance. CGSI is a member of the Australian Student Tuition Assurance Scheme operated by the Australian Council for Private Education and Training.

If CGSI discontinues a course of study in which a student is enrolled, the student is entitled to:

- An offer of a place in a similar course of study with another higher education provider where possible, without any requirement to pay that provider any student contribution or tuition fee for any replacement units of study for which fees have already been paid (as outlined above);
 - or
- A refund of up-front payments paid for any unit of study that the student commences but does not complete because CGSI ceases to provide the course of which the subject forms part.

APPEALS

A student may appeal against a decision made under this policy, excluding decisions made by CGSI or TEQSA to place courses into teach out. Appeals must be made as outlined in the *Grievance Complaints* and Appeals Policy and Procedure.
